

 - Make it easier for stakeholders actively working towards the same objectives to connect and collaborate
 - First step towards aligning efforts and finding ways to collaborate
- A bottom-up exercise, which will be open to all interested parties.

What does WGDT do?

Terms of Reference

The WGDT will follow-up on implementation of Actions 28-33 in Chapter III of the Pact and its Annex, the Global Digital Compact. In this regard, the WGDT will be responsible for (as relevant):

- 1. Coordinating and overseeing the implementation of actions within its purview for dedicated UN follow-up (actions assigned to the Secretary-General and the UN System).
- 2. Monitoring, tracking and supporting actions assigned to Member States, the IFIs and other actors within its purview.
- 3. Undertaking continued analysis and advocacy for implementation of the action points within its purview.
- 4. Supporting RCs and UNCTs to be capacitated, informed and coordinated in support of GDC implementation through existing structures (e.g. DCO and the Technical Support Group of the Joint SDG Fund's Digital Window).

In this context, we request the Commission on Science and Technology for Development to establish a dedicated working group to engage in a comprehensive and inclusive multi-stakeholder dialogue on data governance at all levels as relevant for development.
